## Peninsula Geological Society Field Trip to the Napa Valley

This field trip will be a preview of a forthcoming book by Jonathan Swinchatt and David Howell *The Winemaker's Dance—the people, wines and geology of Napa Valley*. During the trip (besides sampling a variety of great wines) we will review evidence for the tectonic evolution of Napa Valley that includes volcanic conflagrations, extensional faulting, convergence and uplift, and a final collapse involving gigantic landslides. ## **Itinerary:**

- —7:45 AM Meet at either Stanford (Geology Corner) or USGS (flagpole in front of Map Sales Building 3) *or* you can meet us in Napa Valley:
- —10:00 AM Be at **Opus One Winery**, 7900 Saint Helena Hwy., Oakville (directions below)
- —The trip will end with a private tasting at Stag's Leap Wine Cellars, concluding ca. 5:00 PM

## Directions to Stop #1 (Driving time from Menlo Park, Calif., 2 hrs.):

- —Highway 101 to Highway 80 East across the Bay Bridge.
- —Continue on Highway 80 through Berkeley and head Northeast toward Sacramento
- —Cross the Carquinez Bridge (\$2.00 toll) and continue through Vallejo
- —As you are leaving Vallejo, take the Highway 37 to Napa exit
- —After approximately 2 miles turn right (North) onto Highway 29 (which is also Sonoma Avenue) toward Napa, Sonoma, and Calistoga
- —After approximately 7 miles, Highway 29 becomes 3 lanes. Stay to the left continuing on Highway 29 toward Sonoma/Calistoga
- —Stay on Highway 29 North through Napa, Yountville, and Oakville (approximately 20 miles)
- —Opus One Winery is just north of Oakville on the right hand-side
